# Performance at a Glance

## Difficulties of travelling

↑ Flight tickets cost up to **x2 more** in Africa than Europe

👉 Cost per km in Africa ≈ 14× higher than in Europe. African athletes pay +1,300% per km on average

## African Open Series

↓ **\$18.8K**

## Event Cost



↓ African Open Series cost **x3 less** than a G1

Of the 46 least developed countries (LDCs), 33 are in Africa, where sports are not a top priority, except for football.

## G1

↑ **\$63.8K**

The comparison shows that the most expensive option is 3.4 times more costly (+240%) due to cumulative structural costs like travel, accommodation, hosting fees, and event management requirements. A reduced-cost model encourages broader participation and a stronger development impact while maintaining acceptable operational standards.

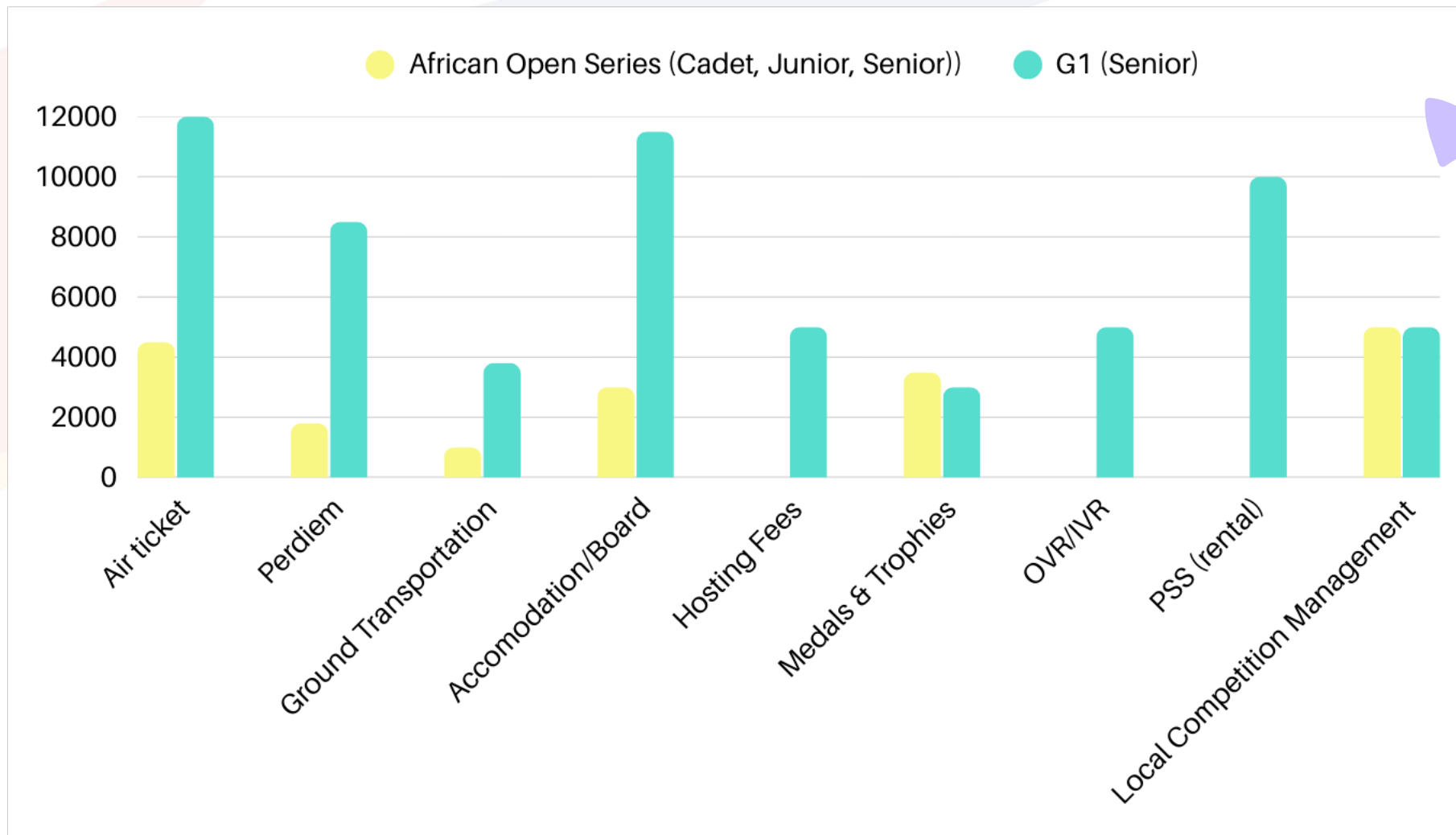

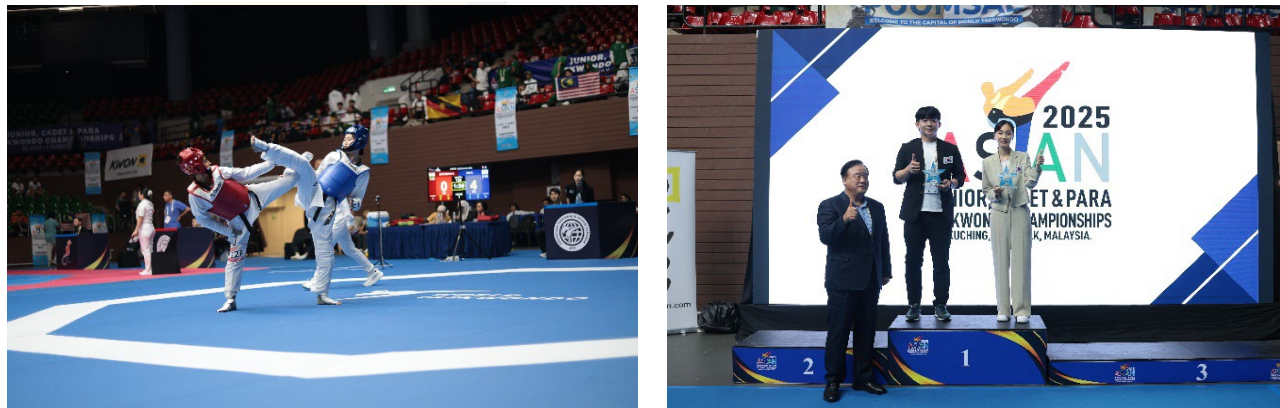

- Governance workshops for MNA leadership and key staff
- Financial transparency and accountability frameworks
- Digital tools and standardised documentation
- Professional administration as the base for trust and quality events

# Pillar 2: Education & Human Capital

- Structured education pathways for coaches, referees, administrators and classifiers
- Blended model: online learning plus physical courses at key ETU events
- Europe leads in qualified coaches globally, yet capacity is concentrated in few MNAs
- Education strengthens safe sport, fairness, and consistent standards

# Pillar 3: Sport Development & Performance

- Talent pathways that connect grassroots, youth, and high performance
- Training camps and development activities aligned with education outcomes
- Targeted programs for women and youth participation
- Support MNAs with limited performance structures to access best practice

# Pillar 4: Solidarity & Sustainability

- Support emerging and underrepresented MNAs through targeted programmes
- Para Taekwondo participation remains uneven (only 31 of 52 MNAs active)
- Increase classification capacity (international classifiers exist in only 9 countries)
- Regional cooperation and long-term impact through focused investment

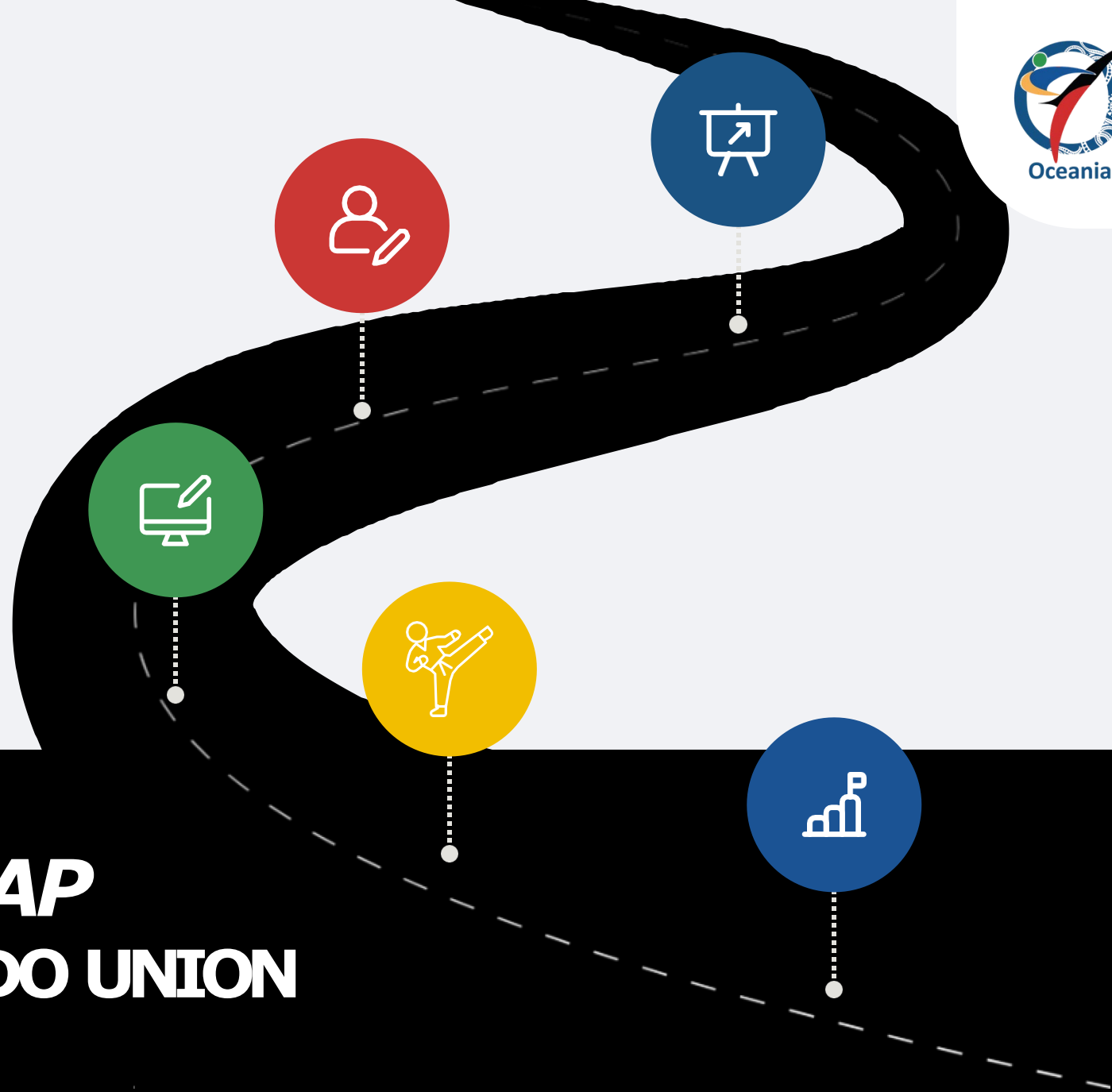

The circular shape forms the foundation of the logo, symbolising:

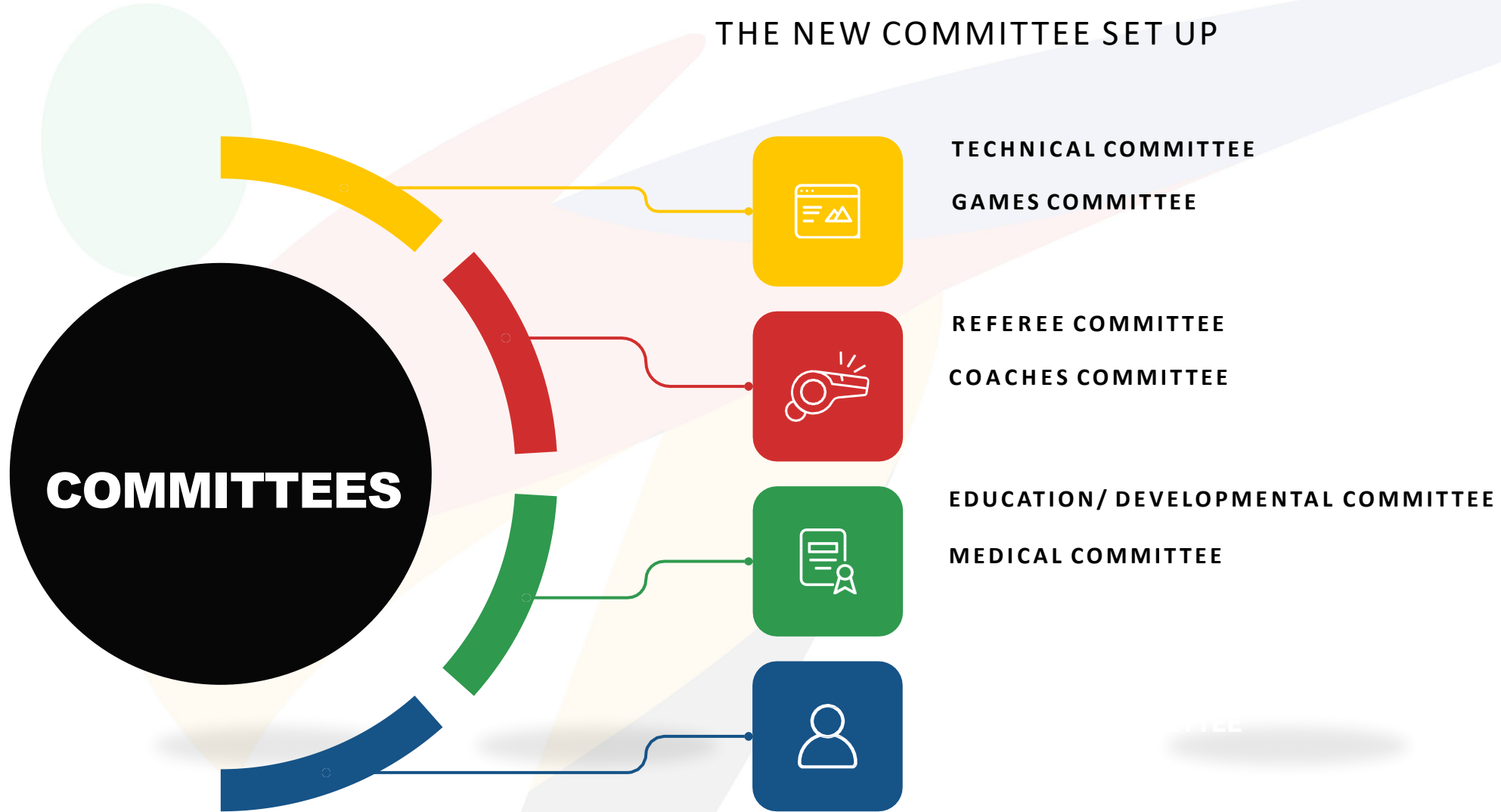
- unity across Oceania's nations and islands

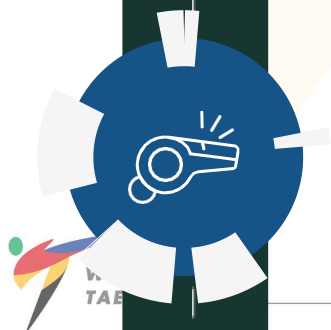
